A favorite story I like to tell is of Yakov Smirnoff, a comedian from the old Soviet Union who immigrated to the United States in 1977. As he detailed the joys and wonders of this great country, he described a visit to the local store one day. He was amazed by the variety of products available there, things he didn't even know existed. Down one aisle he saw powdered milk – and it said on the carton: just add water, and you will get milk! "What a country", he said. Next he came upon powdered eggs – just add water and you will have eggs! Again, "what a country!" Finally he rounded the corner and there on the shelf was baby powder – all he could say was: "wow, what a country."

That silly story has a great truth for us all to be reminded of: it is a privilege to live in this great country and to call America our home. God may call us elsewhere, but until He does I believe we should thank Him for the freedom and privileges we have to live here. As you celebrate Independence Day, I hope you enjoy time with family and friends in the land of the free and the home of the brave.

But like a dear family member who is also in great need, though we love our country we realize that America is struggling. Decades of rejection of God has made us a shell of what we once were. Founded on Christian principles, honoring God in all our institutions, even passing laws that aligned with Biblical morality seems like just a memory of a time long, long ago. We have replaced prayer in schools with pride marches and parading of wickedness that just a few years ago would have been hard to believe. Now it's the norm. Godly leadership in our government is nearly impossible to find, while it seems the entirety of society bows to the lies of the evil one.

I believe it was in 1965 when Ruth Graham stated: "If God doesn't punish America, He'll have to apologize to Sodom and Gomorrah." I am so thankful that Mrs. Graham hasn't had to witness what you and I have seen lately.

In spite of it all, though, there is hope! Would you have believed that Roe v. Wade would be overturned? It has.
